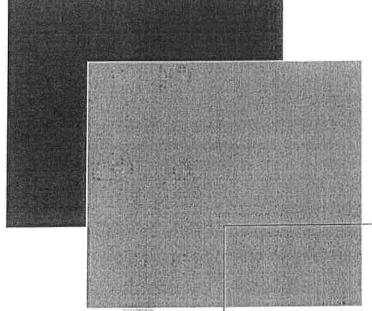

3.0 PremierOne CSR Upgrade Assumptions

- As part of the ongoing Motorola maintenance contract, the City is entitled to receive an equal number of software licenses for the upgraded PremierOne CSR software at no cost. An audit will be conducted by Motorola to determine the number of licenses currently being used by the City.
