The invitation to bid was sent to twelve (12) vendors as well as formally advertised. Four (4) bids were received. The bids are retained on file in the Purchasing Office for your review upon request. A spreadsheet is attached showing the amounts bid.

Although Yami Enterprises and US Lawns submitted lower bids, these bids were rejected. Yami Enterprises proposed a joint venture with Images Landscape Service, but Images Landscape Service did not agree with the proposed terms. US Lawns did not submit the required documents to permit evaluation of its bid.

I recommend awarding this blanket contract to Images Landscape Service, based on the lowest bid meeting the specifications for the City of Chattanooga.
