





#### Instructions for Certification

- By signing and submitting this form, the prospective food service vendor is providing the certification set out on the reverse side in accordance with these instructions.
- The inability of a person to provide the certification required below will not necessarily result in denial of participation in this covered transaction. The prospective food service vendor shall submit an explanation of why it cannot provide the certification set out on this form. The certification or explanation will be considered in connection with the department or agency's determination whether to enter into this transaction. However, failure of the prospective food service vendor to furnish a certification or an explanation shall disqualify such person from participation in this transaction.
- 3. The certification in this clause is a material representation of fact upon which reliance was placed when the department or agency determined to enter into this transaction.
