Instructions for Certification

1. By signing and submitting this form, the prospective food service vendor is providing the certification set out on the reverse side in accordance with these instructions.
2. The inability of a person to provide the certification required below will not necessarily result in denial of participation in this covered transaction. The prospective food service vendor shall submit an explanation of why it cannot provide the certification set out on this form.
