

Council approval is recommended to issue a blanket contract for Sewer Chemical Root Control Services for the Waste Resources Division of the Public Works Department. These chemicals are used to kill and inhibit regrowth of tree and plant roots that have intruded into sewer lines. The contract term will be for twelve (12) months with the option to renew for two (2) additional twelve (12) month periods. The estimated annual expenditure for the contract is \$75,000.

The invitation to bid was sent to eight (8) vendors as well as formally advertised. Two (2) responses were received as shown below and on the attachment. Copies of the bids are retained on file and available for review in the Purchasing Office upon request.

The specifications for this service excluded active ingredients with acute toxicity and favored non-carcinogenic and non-volatile active ingredients in the interest of personnel safety. The active ingredient in the product used by Municipal Sales is classified in some sources as possibly carcinogenic and harmful if inhaled or swallowed. The active ingredient in the product used by Duke's Root Control is classified in other sources as having evidence of non-carcinogenicity but also being harmful if inhaled or swallowed. Although both products obviously require careful handling and use, the active ingredient in the Duke's Root Control product appears to be the safer choice over the active ingredient in the Municipal Sales product.

I recommend awarding this blanket contract to Duke's Root Control, Inc. Although the Municipal Sales prices are lower, the bulk of the work is expected in eight (8) inch sewer pipes where the price difference is smallest. Work on manholes where the price difference is greatest is expected to be rare. Most importantly, the product used by Duke's Root Control appears to be the more prudent choice for safety reasons. Consequently, Duke's Root Control, Inc. offers the best bid which meets the specifications for the City of Chattanooga.




