

City Council Building Chattanooga, Tennessee **COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES** June 5, 2018 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Ken Smith called the meeting to order with Vice-Chairman Erskine Oglesby and Councilpersons Carol Berz, Anthony Byrd, Demetrus Coonrod, Russell Gilbert, Chip Henderson, Darrin Ledford and Jerry Mitchell. Wade Hinton, City Attorney, and Nicole Gwyn, Council Clerk, were also present.

PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilman Ledford led the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

CPD's two teams will advanced to the National Certifications. He also recognized K-9 Duco for seven years of service. Chairman Smith commented on their national placements. Councilwoman Berz inquired about what happens with K-9 Duco after retirement. Chief Roddy informed the Council that he will live with his previous handler, who is also retired from the CPD.

Firefighter Photo Goes Viral

Chairman Smith informed the Assembly of being at the latest playground groundbreaking in Murray Hills. He thanked everyone who helped to make that playground opening and community gathering happen. He told about a fire department crew that was at the event in the morning, lending assistance and displaying their trucks to children. When his 7-year-old fell and the firefighters rushed over to check on him. Immediately after the ribbon cutting, there was a bad car accident. One of the firefighters at the park opening, Captain Chris Blazek, also rushed to aid the families and children involved in the car accident. Captain Blazek was photographed holding one of the children from the accident. The child was sleeping peacefully. The photo went viral on social media. Chairman Smith thought it tied into what the men and women do in the CFD on a daily basis, helping children at a groundbreaking to rescuing kids in severe accidents and providing comfort for families in difficult times. He thanked Chief Hyman and the men and women of the Chattanooga Fire Department for what they do on a daily basis, which people do not always have a chance to see.
