

City Council Building Chattanooga, Tennessee COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES August 14, 2018 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Ken Smith called the meeting to order with Vice-Chairman Erskine Oglesby and Councilpersons Carol Berz, Anthony Byrd, Demetrus Coonrod, Russell Gilbert, Chip Henderson, Darrin Ledford and Jerry Mitchell. Phil Noblett, Deputy City Attorney, and Nicole Gwyn, Council Clerk, were also present.

The following ordinance was read and considered by the Council:

An ordinance to amend Chattanooga City Code, Part II, Chapter 38, Zoning Ordinance, Article II; Article V, Sections 38-183, 38-203, and 38-263; and Article XVI, Sections 38-706, 38-725, and 38-736 relating to Home Occupation and Catering Service. (Recommended for approval by Planning and recommended for denial by Staff)

Discussion ensued about the two versions of the ordinance currently on the agenda. Attorney Noblett explained how this amendment came by recommendation of the Board of Zoning Appeals (BOZA) that went through Planning. BOZA was prompted to consider an amendment when a variance request came before them in October that would allow a restaurant in an office zone. He discussed restaurants not being allowed in office zones in current City Code.

Councilman Ledford requested to hear from Scott McColpin, Chairman of the BOZA, who presented a copy of a letter previously sent to the Council. Mr. McColpin indicated that the Applicant in the case requested an interpretation of the term, "professional office," as used in City Code. BOZA ruled that a catering service was not an office use. He indicated that City Code does not address catering services specifically. BOZA was concerned with a precedence being set if they allowed a catering businesses in an office zone. He informed the Council that BOZA was unanimous during its June meeting with a resolution.

Councilwoman Berz asked Mr. Bridger why Staff recommended denying the first ordinance. Attorney Noblett discussed the difference between the two ordinances: *Article XVI, Sections 38-706, 38-725, and 38-736* had been removed from the second ordinance, which was recommended by Staff and the City Attorney's Office, because would conflict with the city's Form-Based Code.

Councilman Gilbert requested to hear the zones where these uses would be allowed if the ordinance is passed. Attorney Noblett read *C-2 Commercial, UGC Urban Commercial, C-5 Neighborhood Commercial Zone and Downtown FBC.* He also confirmed for Councilman Gilbert that the Applicant could not open a catering business in C-5 if the amendment is passed.

RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WISHING TO ADDRESS COUNCIL (Non-Agenda Items)

Attorney Noblett read the rules of procedure for persons wishing to address the Council on nonagenda items. After which, Chairman Smith recognized the following persons:

- Randle Lee Jones, Sr. (District 8) Mr. Jones informed the Council that he has lived in Chattanooga for 49 years and is a Navy veteran. He believes there is a city-wide security breach that has allowed ISIS to operate in the city. He believes he is being followed and hopes to be put in touch with the FBI to inform them of information he knows. He requested a meeting with Councilman Byrd, his district representative, to discuss getting his information to federal agencies. He noted that he also needs an attorney.
 - Councilman Byrd asked to speak with Mr. Jones after tonight's meeting to exchange numbers and see how he might be of assistance.
 - Councilwoman Coonrod thanked Mr. Jones for his service to this country and asked Administration if they had service agencies that could assist with Mr. Jones's concerns.
 - Stacy Richardson, Chief of Staff, informed the Assembly that they have several service organizations that may be of assistance to Mr. Jones.
 - Councilman Henderson noted also that Hamilton County has veterans' organizations that could be of assistance.
- Vincent Stan (Chattanooga) His organization, Connecting Veterans to Resources, is ready and willing to help get direct aid to Mr. Jones.

• Richard Campbell (Chattanooga) – He wanted to inform the Council of a disturbance at a recent protest where 6-7 people were disturbing 4,000 protestors. He went to Crowd Control staff about the disturbance, but is concerned about protestors having their lawful events disrupted by others. He prepared a 1-page document that he distributed to the Council with information from the Defined Law website on protestor's rights.
