

#### City Council Building Chattanooga, Tennessee COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES May 7, 2019 6:00 PM

#### CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Erskine Oglesby called the meeting to order with Vice-Chairman Chip Henderson and Councilpersons Carol Berz, Anthony Byrd, Demetrus Coonrod, Russell Gilbert, Darrin Ledford and Jerry Mitchell. Phil Noblett, City Attorney, and Nicole Gwyn, Council Clerk, were also present. Councilman Ken Smith was not present this meeting.

#### PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Councilwoman Berz led the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance.

#### ORDINANCE #13457

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, CHAPTER 26, ARTICLE I, SECTION 26-22, BY DELETING THE CAPTION "RESERVED" AND ADDING A NEW HEADING ENTITLED, "NON-MOTORIZED WATERCRAFT PUBLIC LAUNCH ACCESS".

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHATTANOOGA CITY CODE, PART II, CHAPTER 26, SECTION 26-3 RELATING TO OPERATION OF VEHICLES IN PARKS; CHAPTER 26, SECTION 26-4 RELATING TO RECKLESS SPEEDS; CHAPTER 24, SECTION 24-33 RELATING TO OVERTAKING AND PASSING OF VEHICLES PROCEEDING IN THE SAME DIRECTION; AND CHAPTER 24, SECTIONS 24-511 THROUGH 24-523, TO ESTABLISH RULES AND REGULATIONS RELATING TO THE OPERATION OF THE REGULATION OF DOCKLESS SMALL VEHICLE SHARING PROGRAMS.

Councilwoman Berz inquired about an opinion from Keith Reisman, Assistant City Attorney regarding a waiver and the assumption of risk. Neither Attorney Noblett nor Blythe Bailey, Transportation Administrator, had seen an opinion today from Mr. Reisman. Councilwoman Berz discussed wanting to amend the ordinance by adding the wording "...in accordance with T.C.A. 70-7-102..." to section 24-513(e) of this ordinance. Therefore, **Councilwoman Berz moved** to approve with the intent to amend, seconded by Councilman Mitchell. The motion carried. **Councilwoman** 

**Berz moved** to amend by adding the language "...in accordance with T.C.A. 70-7-102..." to Section 24-513(e). She was seconded by Councilman Mitchell. The motion carried, with Councilman Ledford voting "No" and Councilman Henderson abstaining.

**Councilwoman Berz moved** to approve as amended, seconded by Councilman Mitchell. The motion carried, with Councilmen Ledford and Henderson both voting "No." Attorney Noblett confirmed that this would send the ordinance back to second and final reading next week.

# RECOGNITION OF PERSONS WISHING TO ADDRESS COUNCIL (Non-Agenda Items)

Attorney Noblett read the rules of procedure for persons wishing to address the Council on nonagenda items. After which, Chairman Oglesby recognized the following persons:

- Francis Forrester She attended the Beer & Wrecker Board meeting last week and had two problems. She does not believe the body is complete. She has noticed that two board members have not shown up. People were getting slapped with violations, but the board could not rule on these violations due to a lack of quorum. She understands that board members are appointed by the Council to represent districts. She asked the Council to ensure that there is more consistency in board actions and board member attendance.
- Terri Gresham (Valley Brook) She understands that there is a rezoning case coming that will enable a 3-unit complex at Shelby Circle and Middle Valley Road. She indicated that the homeowners were not aware of this rezoning. She gathered a petition against the complex. They have a traffic problem already, especially with the cut-through traffic. This unit will put possibly 36 more cars at that complex. She is worried about property values going down due to the complex and the fact that there is no vegetative buffer. She asked that if the complex is approved by the Council, then also please approve sidewalks. She will be here next week for the hearing on this rezoning matter.
- Nathan King (Kirby Avenue) He came on behalf of Citizens Concerned for Justice (CCJ) to read a statement regarding the Police Advisory & Review Committee going through approval by the Council.
  - Since this was an agenda item, Chairman Oglesby would not allow Mr. King to speak on the matter, per Council rules.
- Jim Johnson (N. Chattanooga) He has been in Chattanooga for 20 years and it has changed his life. In celebrating his time here, he wanted to share information about an upcoming event, "Bluegrass in the Park," taking place on May 18 from 5:00 p.m. 9:00 p.m. He distributed copies of the event poster to the Council and mentioned that one of the musical guests will be Fletcher Bright's band, Dismembered Tennesseans. He also became a triathlon participant in Chattanooga, so he thought this concert would be a good lead-in to the upcoming Ironman competition.
