

Electronic-Conducted (Virtual) Minutes Chattanooga, Tennessee **COUNCIL MEETING MINUTES** May 12, 2020 6:00 PM

CALL TO ORDER

Council Chairman Chip Henderson called the meeting to order by electronic means. A quorum was present that included Vice-Chairman Ken Smith and Councilpersons Carol Berz, Anthony Byrd, Demetrus Coonrod, Russell Gilbert, Darrin Ledford, and Erskine Oglesby, Jr. Phil Noblett, City Attorney, and Nicole Gwyn, Council Clerk, were also present via electronic means. PLEDGE OF ALLEGIANCE

Chairman Henderson led the Assembly in the Pledge of Allegiance and read scriptures from Matthew 6 of the Bible for the invocation.

APPROVAL OF LAST MINUTES

On motion of Councilman Gilbert and seconded by Councilwoman Berz, the minutes of the last meeting (May 5, 2020) were approved as published. The motion carried unanimously (8-0) upon roll call vote.

MOTIONS BRINGING A QUESTION AGAIN BEFORE THE ASSEMBLY (2 items)

(1) <u>Rescinding Appointment Confirmation</u>

Vice-Chairman Smith spoke on recent information that came to the Council's attention about their appointment confirmation of the city treasurer. He noted that the information had not been disclosed to the Council as part of their decision on the appointment confirmation. Therefore, due to a lack of disclosure of this information, **Vice-Chairman Smith moved** to rescind the appointment confirmation previously adopted. He was seconded by Councilman Ledford. Reflections on Ahmaud Arbery

Councilwoman Coonrod reflected on the death of Ahmaud Arbery in Brunswick, Ga, who was killed while out jogging. She spoke on incidents like this sparking distrust in African American communities. She commented on how this incident affected the military trying to administer COVID-testing here in Chattanooga.
